COSHOCTON CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT SEMIANNUAL BULLYING AND HARASSMENT REPORT SUMMARY

Pursuant to O.R.C. §3313.666, each school district is required to establish a policy prohibiting harassment, intimidation, or bullying, and semiannually post on its website a written summary of all reported incidents. The law defines harassment, intimidation, or bullying as any intentional written, verbal, or physical act that a student has exhibited toward another particular student more than once and the behavior both causes mental or physical harm to the other student and is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for the other student, or violence within a dating relationship.

During the period beginning August 23, 2017, and ending December 20, 2017, the following number of incidents that constituted harassment, intimidation, or bullying under the law were reported:
