Organize your current event as follows:

**First and Last Name**  
**Date**

**Title of Article**  
**Author**  
**Website**

### **Paragraph 1 (minimum 7 sentences):**

A summary of the article using your own words. Be sure to use helpful background information to help the reader understand what the article is about. Make sure it is an article you understand and are interested in! If you do not like it or cannot find enough information then find another article!

### **Paragraph 2 (minimum 7 sentences):**

Write a thoughtful reflection about what you think about the article. Choose one of the following questions to base your reflection off:

- What did you learn that you did not know before?
- How does this relate to what we are learning in science class or another class
- What questions would you ask the author that were not explored in the author?
